

OJIBWAY PARK WILDLIFE ECO-PASSAGE PLANNING INVESTMENT HIGHLIGHTS

The Community Benefits Plan is bringing enhancements to Sandwich/west Windsor and Delray/Southwest Detroit through investments in programming, events and infrastructure improvements. Learn more about the plan at GordieHoweInternationalBridge.com.

In 2020, the *City of Windsor* received Neighbourhood Infrastructure Strategy funding to undertake an Environmental Assessment for the Ojibway Park – Black Oak Heritage Park Wildlife Eco-Passage project, to identify a preferred design for the proposed wildlife crossing. The Assessment was part of a larger Community Benefits Plan commitment of \$1.5 million of seed funding that would be released once the City had confirmed the feasibility of the project and secured all required approvals, permits and additional funds for the project.

In 2023, it was determined that it would not be feasible for the Ojibway Park – Black Oak Heritage Park Wildlife Eco-Passage project to be delivered before the end of the Community Benefits delivery period of March 31, 2025, and as such the commitment to provide funding to the project was formally dissolved. This funding will be redirected to support new investment opportunities in Sandwich/west Windsor that are similar in spirit and intent to the project.
