Gordie Howe International Bridge Multi-use Path

The Gordie Howe International Bridge project includes a dedicated multi-use path that will accommodate pedestrians and cyclists across the Windsor-Detroit border once complete. The multi-use path will be toll-free and includes one lane that will accommodate two-way pedestrian and cyclist traffic.
